



WHO SHOULD GET ANTIBODY TESTING?

PCR diagnostic testing continues to steer much of the decision making about quarantine and work clearance. With that in mind, patients will fall into one of two categories:

First category includes patients that would be candidates for PCR testing:

Follow the current criteria to determine who is a candidate for PCR diagnostic testing.

Second category includes patients that are asymptomatic and non-essential workers:

- Do not meet current criteria for PCR testing
- May have had a remote history of symptoms or concern regarding exposure
- Consider Antibody only testing Antibody testing to assess for possible prior exposure and possible immunity and improve understanding of community impact

PCR Testing Criteria



NEW AS OF 4/27/2020: CDC PCR TESTING CRITERIA

New information was just released from the CDC on prioritization of PCR testing! **Providers should use their judgment** to determine if a patient has signs and symptoms compatible with COVID-19 and **whether the patient should be tested**. Most patients with confirmed COVID-19 have developed fever and/or symptoms of acute respiratory illness (e.g., cough, difficulty breathing).

NOTE: Catalyst Testing Sites will do PCR diagnostic testing for both CDC HIGH Priority and Priority patients (NEW).

NEW: CDC PRIORITIES FOR COVID-19 TESTING

High Priority

- Hospitalized patients
- Healthcare facility workers, workers in congregate living settings, and first responders with symptoms
- Residents in long-term care facilities or other congregate living settings, including prisons and shelters, with symptoms
- Persons identified through public health cluster and selected contact investigations

Priority

- Persons with symptoms of potential COVID-19 infection, including fever, cough, shortness of breath, chills, muscle pain, new loss of taste or smell, vomiting or diarrhea and/or sore throat
- Persons without symptoms who are prioritized by health departments or clinicians, for any reason, including but not limited to: public health monitoring, sentinel surveillance, or screening of other asymptomatic individuals according to state and local plans.

PCR Testing Criteria



NEW AS OF 4/27/2020: CDC PCR TESTING CRITERIA

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
- Patients who need testing prior to surgery (obtain PCR plus antibody testing)
 - If entering in LeadingReach for NTX Testing Sites, choose "Other" and use the free text field to specify "PCR + Antibody"
- Asymptomatic, frontline essential worker who was exposed < 14 days prior to testing
- Patients with a recent history of undiagnosed COVID-like symptoms who need to be cleared for work, given:
 - No know COVID-19 exposure history
 - Asymptomatic < 3 days

AND/OR

- < 7 days since COVID-like symptom onset

Consider Options: Obtain PCR PLUS Antibody testing (takes an average of 3 days for results) **OR WAIT for the 3- and 7-day windows** above to pass.









POST-TESTING FOLLOW-UP




Centralized Testing Sites NTX



PCP Practice Workflow



Ordering Testing



- 1. During triage or a virtual visit, screen the patient to determine testing needs
- 2. Confirm the patient's **email address**
- 3. Inform the patient of **next steps**
- 4. Complete the **PUI Form** (for PCR testing only)
- 5. Complete a **CPL lab requisition** with the appropriate details
 - For CPL Accounts, order through your normal route
 - For NO CPL Account, order through CPL CHN Infectious Disease Lab Requisition
- 6. Using the **Reason field drop down** to specify testing type, **send a referral via LeadingReach**, including appropriate attachments
 - Demographics & insurance
 - PUI form
 - CPL lab requisition
 - **7. Test results** are delivered to the PCP directly
 - Average 3 days
 - Deliver directly to the PCP via their CPL account or automated fax



Lab Results

NEW: Test results will be delivered to the PCP via the CPL account or via automated fax if you do not have a CPL account.

- PCP contacts patient with test results
 - For positive test results, PCP contacts the Health Department and should document all actions in patient's chart to reflect instructions and care plan.
- REFERENCE PATIENT HANDOUT: "Guidance for Care After Test Result Obtained"

If you DO have a CPL Account, you will receive results through your normal pathway

If you DO NOT have a CPL Account, you will receive results through automated fax
